### Area Stars To "Invade" Angelica

Area stars from half a dozen local tracks plan to invade Angelica Raceway on Wednesday night, August 11th for the First Annual Fair Invitational Stock Car Race. The program will feature 1960 through 1965 cars with qualifying heats and semi-finals, capped by a 40-lap feature. With the largest guaranteed purse ever offered, the event is expected to draw drivers from at least two states.

Leading the list of drivers is 3-time Angelica Raceway Champion Pete Tingue with his 1965 Oldsmobile. Dick Flaig of Williamsville, N. Y., will be on hand with his 1965 Chevrolet in an attempt to add more trophies to his collection. Flaig has taken the midseason championship for new cars at both Holland Raceway and Perry Raceway this season. Current high point king of Clean Raceway, Ray Jordan, will be on hand with a '65 Chevy while Sportsman's Raceway will be represented by Bill Layfield with a 1965 Buick. Other early entries include the Harold Sherwood 8 car fleet from Pennsylvania including a '64 Chevy, '62 Chevy, and a '62 Ford. Paul H. deck with a '61 Chevy and Bud Perkins with a '60 Dodge are currently in a tight duel for points at Hornell Raceway and both are expected for the Angelica affair.

Other Eastern Racing Circuit of drivers who have announced plans to be there include Eddie Anchor, '65 Chevy; Moe Kesler, '64 Chevy; DeVere Bliss, '65 Chevy; Eddie Almeter, '65 Chevy; and Dick Newton with a '65 Chevy. Ken Wrobel will bring his '64 Ford in while several other Fords are expected when the first heats line up at 8:30.

Stateline Speedway will be represented by Zon Davison with a 1965 Plymouth. Several other drivers from Stateline have also hinted that they might be on hand.
