### Bass Arrive

Eighteen cooperators of the Allegany County Soil & Water Conservation District recently received bass for stocking their ponds. These fish are obtained by the Allegany County Soil & Water Conservation District for their cooperators through a Memorandum of Understanding with the Department of Interior.

Ponds built by the District which are over 1/4 acre in size and less than 10 acres can be stocked with fish.

It is usually necessary to stock bass in ponds only once as they will reproduce when two years old. Bass are considered warm water fish and summer temperature of the pond should reach 80 degrees.
