Rainfall at Belmont, N.Y. for the month of July 1965 according to the Soil Conservation Service technicians was 3.36". This is considerably more rainfall than 3.36". This is considerably more radial than many areas of Allegany (jointy received. This also is more rainfal' than many barts of New York State experienced.

Belmont was 10.48" from Apri through July. This is 5" below the five year average from 1960-1965. This, coupled with a 3 year below average minifall, has reduced the potential supply of water avaitable for crop production and also underground water reserves.
