A 45 day split gunning season on ducks and coots for most of New York State has been announced by the Conservation Depart-

New York State has been announced by the Conservation Department.

The only exception, a small area bordering Lake Champlain, represents a major breakthrought for New York gunners and is the first time since 1946 the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service has permitted a division of the upstate season. For the new Lake Champlain zone the season will run for 50 days straight on ducks and coots, Oct. 16 - Dec. 4. A 70 day season, running Oct. 16 - Dec. 24, has been set for geese and brant.

For upstate New York (except the Lake Champlain zone, the 45 day split season on ducks and coots will be Oct. 16 - Nov. 20 and Jan. 1 - 9. A 70 day straight season on geese and brant runs, Oct. 16 - Dec. 24.

According to Ralph B. Colson, Chief of the Bureau of Game in the Conservation Department, the gunning season for the Lake Champlain zone coincides with the Vermont season and an and waterfowl management. The Lake Champlain zone is designated as lying east of the main line of the D & H railroad from the Canadian border to Whitehall (including South Bay and one mile distant from it in any direction) and north of the D & H branch line from Whitehall to the Vermont border.

Colson said other major changes in the waterfowl regulations include the re-introduction of a scaup bonus of two birds daily and four in possession on and after November 15. This provision was in effect in 1963 but dropped last season.

In addition to the scaup bonus, redhead ducks are included with the regular three duck per day bag limit. Canvasbacks, wood ducks and mallards each have cally limit of two. Possession limits of two.


