Allegany County was one of four counties chosen for a study of timber resource development in Appalachia, it has been announced in Washington. The firm will study forest re-

sources in selected areas for purposes of identifying ways of increasing the use of timber. The Associated Press listed the other three counties selected as Breathitt County, Kentucky, and Walker County, Tennessee and Walker County in Alabama.

Employees at six Worthington Corp. plants in New York and New Jersey and Alabama including the Wellsville plant, who had been on strike since Aug. 18, went back to work this week following ratification of a new contract Sunday. A company spokesman said the settlement provides a wage increase averaging eight cents an hour in each of the three years of the new contract along with an extra paid holiday, improved pensions and insurance benefits.
