#### eaflet Explains Contribution Increase

Contribution Increase

A small leaflet, prepared by the Social Security Administration, is available to employers as a payroll check stuffer. The leaflet explains the increase in the social security contribution rate and amount of earnings on which the tax is paid, set for January 1, 1966, L. J. Dziadkowicz, social security district manager in Olean, N. Y., announces. The leaflet shows how these increases will affect a worker's take home pay; how his contribution helps finance retirement, survivors, and disability insurance benefits; how they will pay the costs of the hospital insurance part of medicare; and why they are necessary.




