Please bring your own dishes—buttered rolls and a dish to pass unless otherwise solicited. There will be an exchange of gifts of \$1.00 value.

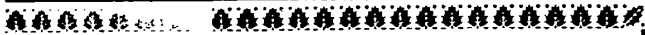
