Yep, with the accumulation of snow piling up along Main St. until traffic was down-right dangerous, Village and Town Officials got together with the result that the snow removal project was started at 2 a. m. today using the Town of Andover equipment and Personnel under the supervision of the Town Highway Superintendent along with the Village equipment and Village Street Superintendent.

The snow was plowed and scraped into the middle of the Street and then loaded on the Town and Village trucks by the Town front-loader.

Everything ran along smoothly until the "Village woke up" — and from then on — the workmen were hampered by thoughtless or selfish motorists that insisted on parking along the long narrow lanes of one way traffic while they completed their errands. With cars parked along in front of the Post Office and other business places, it was very difficult for the trucks loaded with snow (and snow plow on front) to even get by these parked cars.

What we can't understand is why motorists can't have a little consideration when they see a project like this going on and park in several of the free parking lots that were cleared and were only a few steps from any place in the downtown business area.

There were plenty of parking spaces available earlier in the morning in the Market Basket parking lot, as well as in the paved Village parking lot in back of Sacketts, and even the Grange parking area.

It looks as if the Village Fathers will have to pass a Village Ordinance making it illegal to park along any Street while a snow removal project is under way. Then let them pay a fine if they are in violation to help pay for the extra money it is costing all Taxpayers for slowing up the work project. Maybe this is the only way some people will learn the "facts of life". 10-4?

And, while on the subject of Village Ordinances, it would also help to have one prohibiting all night parking on Main St., and even have a time limit on free parking during the day. This would do more to help local business places than anything else we can think of. Especially when there are parking lots very conveniently located for people that are going to be parked for several hours, or any length of time.

The Ordinance would only have to be enforced a few times for the chronic offenders — and the practice would practically come to a screeching halt. How about it?

Two Residents Injured In Near Head-on Collision

Doris Ann Jackson, R.D. 2, Andover, and Gerald Wahl, Jr., Route 17, Andover, were rushed to the St. James Mercy Hospital, Hornell, by the Andover Rescue Squad Ambulance following a near head-on collision on Rochambeau Ave Extension around 4:00 p. m. Tuesday.

According to the State Police report, the accident occurred at 4:10 p. m., as the eastbound Rambler station wagon driven by Doris Ann collided with the Dodge sedan driven by Gerald Wahl, a student at Andover Central School.

According to a report from the family, Mrs. "Jim" Jackson suffered a broken kneecap, lacerations of the chin, and possible chest and internal injuries.

The Wahl youth suffered cuts to the mouth and loss of five teeth and was reported in good condition by hospital authorities on Wednesday.

The station wagon driven by Mrs. Jackson and owned by Clare Jackson, was reported as a total loss. Extensive damage was also suffered by the Wahl vehicle. Both cars had to be towed from the scene of the accident.

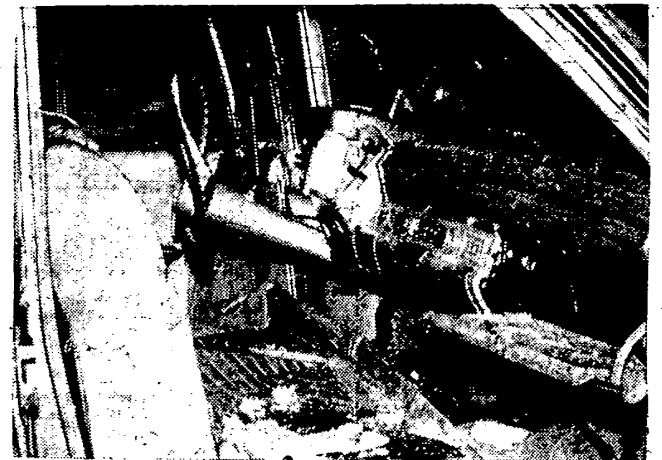
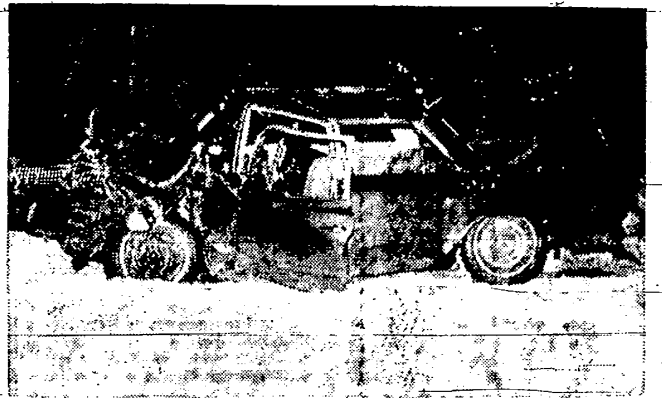

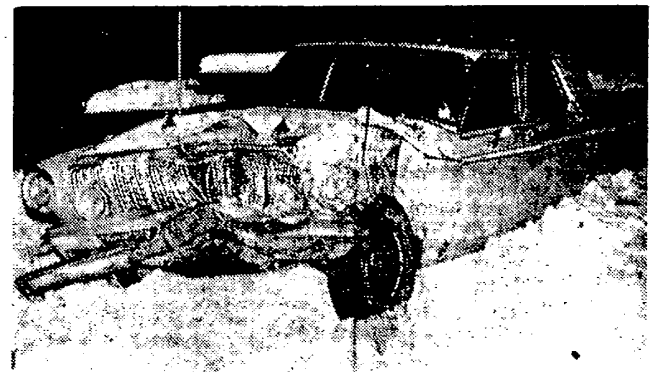
