Lee F. Meyn Attends Judicial Training Program

Honorable Lee F. Meyn, Town Justice, Town of Andover, was one of two hundred sixty-five trainees, (including town justices, village justices and other persons interested in justice court work), in attendance at a judicial training program. The program was the eighth annual Fall Justice Training Program sponsored by the Judicial Conference and held at Buffalo Law School.

Classes were held from 9:00 a. m. until 5:00 p. m. on Fridays and Saturdays for three week-ends in November 1969 and covered such topics as: criminal and civil procedure, treatment of youthful offenders; elements of common crimes; the rules of evidence; vehicle and traffic law violations and the procedure for their disposition.

In addition, advanced training in the field of evidence and the new penal law was offered to experienced justices. The trainees observed court room procedure demonstrations covering both criminal and civil trials. An actual trial demonstration was conducted to familiarize the trainees with the technical problems involved in radar cases. Cooperating state agencies counseled the trainees on the methods and procedures to be observed in filing reports of convictions and fines and fees collected by the justices.

The instructors and lecturers were selected by the Judicial Conference and included law school professors, practicing attorneys active in justice court work, and experienced justices.
