School Board Holds Monthly Meeting

The regular meeting of the Board of Education of Andover Central School was called to order Monday, Jan. 12, by the President Mrs. Mary K. Slade. Mr. Kessler and the following Board members were present: Francis Horan, Robert Tomm, Lawrence Godown and Conner Stephens.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting were read for approval. Motion to approve these minutes was made by Francis Horan. Seconded by L. Godown. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

The minutes of the Special meeting December 18, 1969 were read for approval. Motion to approve these minutes was made by Robert Tomm, seconded by Conner Stephens. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Payrolls amounting to \$41,444.05 gross were read for approval. Motion to approve these was made by Lawrence Godown. Seconded by Francis Horan. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Mr. Kessler read the bills for the month of December amounting to \$10,514.80, plus utilities. Stephens made the motion that these be paid. Robert Tomm, seconded the motion. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Cafeteria bills in the amount of \$988.04 were read. Francis Horan made the motion that these be paid. Lawrence Godown seconded the motion. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

The Treasurer's report was read for approval. Lawrence Godown made the motion that the report be accepted as read. Robert Tomm seconded the motion. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

The Cafeteria report was read by Mr. Kessler, showing a net loss of \$371.46 for the month of December. A motion was made by Francis Horan to file this report with the minutes. Seconded by Conner Stephens. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Interest only is due on Bus No. 24 on February 9, 1970. Lawrence Godown made the motion that this be paid in the amount of \$26.97. Francis Horan seconded the motion. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Resolution to reduce taxes for certain persons filing a claim for 1/2 exemption was read by Mr. Kessler. Motion was made by Conner Stephens, seconded by Lawrence Godown. Carried by 5 yes votes.

Motion made by Francis Horan and seconded by Robert Tomm that letter of appreciation from Mrs. Boyer concerning music conference be filed with minutes. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Article I

Recognition

The Andover Central School Board of Education, having determined that the Andover Central School Teachers Association is supported by a majority of the teachers in a unit composed of all professional, certificated personnel except the Chief Executive Officer, hereby recognizes the Andover Central School Teachers Association as the exclusive negotiating agent for the teachers in such unit. Such recognition shall extend until one hundred and twenty days prior to the annual meeting date in 1972 and for successive periods of two years thereafter.

The Board agrees not to negotiate with any other teacher or

organization other than the Association for the duration of this Agreement.

Francis Horan made the motion to accept this Recognition. Mr. Lawrence Godown seconded the motion. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Francis Horan made the motion to pay the expenses of Mrs. Boyer attending the Music Conference. The amount of this was \$112.90. Robert Tomm seconded. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Robert Tomm made the motion to pay \$75.00 to refill the postage meter. Lawrence Godown seconded. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Francis Horan made the motion to approve the request of Mr. Braco to attend a Social Studies Conference on March 15, 16, 17, 1970. Lawrence Godown seconded. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Mr. Kessler discussed our school system, facilities and philosophy.

Conner Stephens made the motion to adjourn the meeting at 11:15. Seconded by Francis Horan. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Review Provisions Of Stream Protection Law

Persons planning to build dams and docks or do work in the streams or navigable waters of New York State should review provisions of the new Stream Protection Law which became effective January 1, 1966.

The intent of the new Statute is to permit necessary construction while providing safeguards to the environment and the health, safety and welfare of the people of New York State. In summary, the net benefit of construction affecting the State's waters must be in the public interest.

Provisions of the Stream Protection Law bring together under the jurisdiction of the State Water Resources Commission various powers and duties of water resource management formerly carried out by the Departments of Public Works and Conservation. Transfer of responsibility for stream protection to the Water Resources Commission guarantees a broad, multi-agency viewpoint in the administration of the new Law.

The three major areas of jurisdiction under the new Law include control over the disturbance of certain streams dredging and filling navigable waters, and the

construction and maintenance of dams and docks. Persons planning to do work in any of these areas must obtain a permit from the Water Resources Commission.

(Streams in which disturbances are controlled by permit are those classified by the Commission as "C", with a standard for trout water, or higher. These official classifications may be examined at the regional office for Fish and Game or at the local office, the Health Department).

The Water Resources Commission has designated James J. Lindsey, Regional Supervisor for Fish and Game, as local permit agent to receive applications. Local units of government as well as individuals are subject to the provisions of the new Law.

Designation of the Fish and Game regional supervisor as local permit agent is intended to speed processing of applications. In many cases, the supervisor will be able to issue permits at the local level. Where proposed projects may be in conflict with the public interest, the application will be

forwarded for review by the agencies comprising the Water Resources Commission.

Permit application forms for work in any of the three major areas of jurisdiction under the Stream Protection Law are available at the regional office for Fish and Game. Information on the rules and regulations relating to permit application forms, and procedures under the new Law is available at the regional office. Permit application forms specifically for the construction and maintenance of dams (Example: farm ponds) are also available from the county offices of the United States Soil Conservation Services.
