New Rules On Junior Operators

Junior operators may now drive unaccompanied between the hours of 5 a.m. and 8 p.m., the Department of Motor Vehicles has an

ment of Motor Vehicles has announced.

The change results from amendments to both the Vehicle and Traffic Law and the Commissioner's Regulations. Under the new provisions, a junior operator may not drive between the hours of 8 p. m. and 5 a. m. unless accompanied by a parent or guardian This applies to all junior operators regardless of when they obtained their licenses.

Previously, a junior operator could not drive between one-haif hour after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise unless accompanied by a parent or guardian.

There has been no change in the other restrictions governing junior operators. They still may not drive in New York City, or in Nassau County, except under the special provisions described in the Driver's Manual. They also may not operate a motor vehicle for compensation.

Income tax returns with labels can be quickly identified and processed since they contain necessary identifying information, John E. Poley, District Director, Internal Revenue Service, Buffalo says.

If your name or address has changed, make necessary corrections on the label and lightly strike through the wrong pre-printed information. If you have a refund due, this will help insure delivery of the check to the correct address.
