March 19th Set To Open Bids For Southern Tier Expressway

Governor Rockefeller has announced that the State Department of Transportation will open bids on March 19 for earth filling, grading and related work preparatory to construction of 6.7 miles of the Southern Tier Expressway in the Towns of Cuba and Friendship, Allegany County.

The State's share of the project's estimated cost of \$8,046,000 will be paid with funds from the Transportation Bond Issue approved by the voters in 1967.

Embankments for a four-lane divided highway will be built and drainage facilities installed between the villages of Cuba and Friendship on an alignment just north of and parallel to Route 408. Pavements will be built under a subsequent contract.

Route 305 will be widened from two to four lanes for 0.14-mile and North Branch Road will be relocated for 1.35 miles to connect to Route 305 in the Cuba Village area. Governor Rockefeller said additional sections of the Southern Tier Expressway are in advanced stages of design and are expected to be placed under construction this year. When complete by the mid-1970s, the route will extend 239 miles from Binghamton to the western end of New York State.
