## **Assemblyman** Frank Walkley Reports

Assemblyman Frank Walkley (R-Castile) of the 148th Assembly District introduced in the State District introduced in the State Legislature recently legislation designed to curb the spiraling rate of incidents of willful and malicious destruction of property by irresponsible youths.

The measure affords a two pronged approach providing the curt with the power to order either the parent or the child to make restitution for the damage sustained

Assemblyman Walkley stated

Assemblyman Walkley stated that the great majority of today's youth, 94 percent in fact, are responsible members of the community. However, the small segment of the youth population have up to this point caused wanton and willful destruction that must be curbed.

The bill is co-sponsored by nine Senators and eighty-five Assem-

While the bill affords the oppor-While the bill affords the opportunity to recoup the value of damaged or destroyed property, its equal import is that a parent will be aware of his involvement and thus take steps to have a better knowledge of where his child is and more particularly, what the child is doing

The bill covers the youth group over 10 and under 16. It authorizes the Family Court Judge as a condition of probation to order the child found responsible for willful or malicious damage to

izes the Family Court Judge as a condition of probation to order the child found responsible for willful or malicious damage to either pay or replace up to a limit of \$500.00.

Another important provision is the authorization to order the child to perform services on a municipal project in lian of payment of a particular amount. The second aspect of the bill increases the authority of the civil courts to hear cases and order recovery by a party who has suffered damage as a result of willful and wanton destruction by a child from parents or guardian of the child.

### Size Correction Aid Choice To School Districts

Provisions of a bill intranament of state Senate in Albany discussed would provide a choice for school districts in the use of size correction state aid to education. The bill, sponsored by State Senator Edward J. Speno (R-East Meadow), would allow a school district to elect (with relation to size aid to be received after July 1, 1970) a choice for the apportionment of these State funds. They are (1) aid handicapped and vocational pupils from a fund to be administered by the Commissioner of education (2) apportionment of size correction aid paid in 1969/70. The increasing popularity of power tool use has sent sales skyrocketing, but it has also created a vast array of potential hazards as more and more novice hobbyists turn to pow er tools as an ideal activity for passing leisure time. Care-lessness and lack of know-ledge are the two primary contributors to accidents with power tools.

Always read the owner's manual thoroughly and carefully prior to use of tools. -Always ground tools unless they are double insulated.

Whenever power cord is equipped with three-prong plug, use a three-hole elec-trical receptacle. If a twoprong receptacle is al is available, use an adapter and attach adapter wire to a known ground.

-Always keep safety guards

-Never work in a cluttered

Never leave tools lying around when not in use.

-Always use the right tool for the right job. Never force a tool to do a job.

-Never wear jewelry or loose clothing while working with power tools.

-Always wear safety glasses when required.

Whenever possible, use a vise, not your hands, to hold litem on which you are work-

-Always maintain proper footing and balance while operating a tool.

Always look for the UL symbol on the tool.
