At a meeting held last Thursday night (2/12), the Allegany County Planning Board, after lengthy discussion with planning and town boards involved, went on record as favoring a continued study of the Stannards development. The committee will submit a resolution to our board of legislators to this effect.

The County Planning Board made the decision for continued study mainly because it would be conducted at no cost or obligation to the County. I am keeping an open mind on this proposal — and I urge you residents of the County to do the same. This study does not obligate us, and I, for one, would like to have more questions answered. After the study, there will be time for us to decide whether the project would be a growth factor for the county or whether it is undesirable.

You can rest assured I will do my best to promote any activities or endeavor which will make our district and county a better place to live. I am especially interested in the local costs (State and County) which would vitally affect all our people.
