Lee R. Ryan Reports As County Legislator

Allegany County's Comprehensive Health program, established in 1968, will be started all over again, it has been unanimously agreed by the County Public Health Services Committee.
The County group, headed by Legislator Carl Lackey of Cuba, is comprised of Legislators Charles Shine of Wellsville, Rev. William Grossman of Scio and Lee Ryan of Almond.

The decision to reorganize the program was based on the feeling that the Comprehensive Health Care committee did not represent a majority of consumers. The big question before the Public Health Services Committee is which regional office the County group will join: the Ontario Regional Office at Rochester, or the Western New York Regional Office at Buffalo.
A meeting has been set for April 2, at which time representatives of various organizations throughout the County will meet with the Public Health Committee to organize the new Comprehensive Health Care program. The final decision regarding regional affiliation will

be submitted to the legislators for their action.

A new steering committee and board of directors will be elected. It is also expected that a representative from each of the two regional offices will be present to answer questions.

Last Saturday, members of the Public Health Committee met to interview a candidate for the County medical scholarship. Last year, the board of supervisors appropriated \$6,000 for a scholarship fund which is available to students in the medical field who will return to the County to practice.

Henry Macier, Jr., formerly of the Wellsville area, was the first applicant interviewed by the committee. Dr. George Taylor of Cuba attended the interview in an advisory capacity.
