MURDER VICTIM **FOUND TODAY** On Davis Hill Rd.

The body of a murdered mar The body of a murdered man-was discovered around 6:45 A. M., this morning (Friday, March 20), along Davis Hill Road by John Billings, a local resident, who was on his way to work. State Police were notified with Investigator Robert Jackson from Andover, being the first Officer on the scene.

According to State Police, the body was a male, heavy build, apparently between the age of 25 to 40, medium brown hair with no easily identifiable features since both hands and head had been severed.

The Davis Hill Road was sealed off by State Police Investigators to all traffic until they could make a search of the entire area for any possible clues.

According to the State Police report, no effort had been made to conceal the body since it was lying along the road at a spot where it could have been thrown over a bank and been undetected for an indefinite period.

In an interview with one of the Investigating State Police Officers this noon, an urgent request is made for any local resident that has any information which might pertain to this grisly crime to please notify the Wellsville State Police barracks immediately or call the Andover News Office Also, if anyone knows of someone that is missing, it would be greatly appreciated if this information is also passed on to the State Police for investigation.
