Vaccinate Horses Now To Prevent Sleeping Sickness, State Says

Horse owners are advised by the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets to have their animals vaccinated for sleeping sickness before May 1. It is urgent to do this before the beginning of the mosquito seaso, the Department said, because those insects transmit the disaster. those insects transmit the disease.

those insects transmit the disease. Sleeping sickness, or encephalitis in technical language is not passed from infected horses to other horses or humans for the reason that virus particles do not develop, in horse blood in concentrations sufficient to infect the feeding mosquitoes. What happens, according to Dr. Grant S. Kaley, director of the Department's Division of Animal Industry, is that the virus of encephalitis is carried northward by migrating birds each spring. Mosquitoes bite the infected birds an in turn can transmit the infection to horses and humans.

The sleeping sickness inocula

The sleeping sickness inoculations — two are recommended at an interval of seven to 10 days — of bivalent vaccine contain eastern and western encephalitis viruses. Dr. Kaley says they "can be expected to provide a serviceable immunity in horses." He advised horse owners to make early arrangements with their veterin-arians and added that immuniza-tion is particularly important in the southeastern section of New York State. . Property of the disease in this state was confirmed last October when it was found in a flock of 5,00 pheasants in Orange County. No equine or human cases developed.

New Jersey, which e perienced a near epidemic of encephalities in the sammer of 1968, had very few cases in 1969. The improvement is attributed to widespread vaccination among the horse population and also to an effective mosquito control program.

As to precautions to be taken by humans, Dr. Kaley referred ques-tioners to the Health Department.
