Prizes will be awarded for longest fish caught as well as for the heaviest one caught.

An interesting letter from the State of Vermont Fish & Game Dept. was read thanking the Andover Rod & Gun Club for their support and hospitality in entertaining one of their representatives at a previous Club meeting.

Ronnie Kemp, Chairman of the Rod & Gun Club Committee that is working with the Andover 4th of July Parade Committee, announced that the Parade Committee's auction was scheduled for April 18th and that the Rod & Gun Club pick-up would be on Friday afternoon and Saturday morning.

The Fishing Contest Committee announced that the Annual Contest would run from April 1 to the 1st of June with the same regulations as last year. It was stressed that all fish must be taken legally with prizes to be awarded for the longest and heaviest fish caught by youth up to 16 years of age.

Members decided to continue the Pheasant raising and stocking program for another year with an extra pen to be built so that more birds could be raised.

A luncheon was served following the meeting and 8 color-movie movies were shown by Club Member Jerry Hann.
