## Taxpayers Asked To Wait 10 Weeks Before Writing About Delayed Refund

Ten weeks from the date a Federal income tax return calling for a refund is mailed, the taxpayer should have either his check or a letter explaining why it is held up, John E. Foley, District Director, Internal Revenue Service, Buffalo, said today.

A taxpayer who has not heard about his refund should, therefore, wait ten weeks before writing IRS. Most taxpayers will find their inquiry unnecessary if they wait this long, Mr. Foley said.

Millions of tax returns are handled every filing season at the IRS Service Center, Andover, Massachusetts, which serves Buffalo District taxpayers. That many returns makes it practically impossible to locate a particular return and to answer any question about it until processing cycles are complete.

If it does become necessary to write, the taxpayer should indicate where and when he filed his return and give his name, address and Social Security number, Mr. Foley said.
