Uterine cancer would be dramatically reduced as a cause of death if every adult woman would have a "Pap" test once a year. Last year 468 women took advantage of the clinics and it is the hope of the Allegheny Unit of the American Cancer Society that more women can be reached this year.

C of C In Search For New Doctor

With the leaving of Dr. Alan Folsom for a position in New Mexico, Andover is again faced with the problem of no Doctor in the Village.

Officials of the Andover Chamber of Commerce today announced that they have completed a physical inventory of the property list of the Medical Center furnishings and that all agreements have been fully complied with.

The only two items that were removed, as previously agreed upon, were the cardiogram and a desk. In their place, wall-to-wall carpeting has been installed in the Doctor's Office and Children's Room, extra shelving added, and several rooms redecorated — all at the expense of Dr. Folsom.

The Medical Center has been cleaned and inspected and is in excellent order for the immediate occupancy of a new Doctor.

It is felt by Chamber of Commerce Officers, that the task of securing a new Doctor has been made much easier with the Medical Center Facilities available which were so generously donated in the original fund drive by various members of the Community of Andover.

The Chamber of Commerce is grateful to Dr. Folsom for his services rendered while in Andover and regret his leaving.

Meanwhile all efforts and possibilities are being pursued by the Committee to secure another Doctor for Andover.
