July was the most successful month for anglers with 33 percent of the total catch. August accounted for 21 percent, June and September each produced 16 percent while October yielded the remaining 14 percent. The best months for taking large muskies—over 40 inches—were September and October. The lartiest fish taken was an impressive 52 inche which strained the scales at 40 pounds. pounds


