## Board of Ed Holds Monthly Meeting

The regular meeting of the Board of Education of Andover Central School was called to order Monday evening, April 13, 1970 by President, Mary K. Slade. Mr. Kessler and the following Board members were present: Robert Tomm, Larry Godown, Conner Stephens.

The minutes of the previous Special meeting were read for approval. Motion to approve these was made by L. Godown. Seconded by C. Stephens. Carried by 4 votes of yes.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting were read for approval. Robert Tomm made the motion that these be accepted as read. Mr. Godown seconded the motion. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

Mr. Kessler read the bills for the month of March 1970 amounting to \$8,823.25. Conner Stephens made the motion that these be paid. L. Godown seconded the motion. Carried by 4 votes of yes.

Cafeteria bills in the amount of \$1,701.22 were read by Mr. Kessler. The motion to pay these was made by R. Tomm and seconded by L. Godown. Carried by 4 votes of yes.

The Cafeteria report was read by Mr. Kessler, showing a net loss of \$456.43 for the month of March. A motion was made by C. Stephens to file this report with the minutes. Seconded by Robert Tomm. Carried by 4 votes of yes.

The Gross Pay rolls were read for the approval of the Board. The total was \$62,279.06. L. Godown made the motion to accept these as read and Robert Tomm seconded the motion. Carried by 4 votes of yes.

A motion was made to continue in the District bread Bid for the year 1970 - 71. The motion was made by L. Godown and seconded by Robert Tomm.

C. Stephens made the motion that the Board of Education authorize the transfer of \$2,627.00 from BOCES to BOCES transportation fund, to establish a separate account for transportation charges. L. Godown seconded the motion. Passed by 4 votes of yes. Robert Tomm made the motion

that the Board approve the payment to the School Lunch Fund the amount—\$797.36. This amount was credited to the General Fund and it was found to be an item that should be deposited in the School Lunch Fund. L. Godown seconded the motion. Carried by 4 votes of yes.

Robert Tomm made the motion to pay \$10.00 for our part of Hornell Carger Night, April 9, 1970. L. Godown seconded the motion. Passed by 4 yes votes.

L. Godown made the motion that Mrs. Ruth Richmond be given a probationary appointment to teach in our elementary school starting September 1, 1970. L. Godown seconded. Passed by 4 yes votes.

Robert Tomm made the motion that Mrs. Karen Peterson be given a probationary appointment to teach in our elementary school starting September 1, 1970. L. Godown seconded. Passed by 4 yes votes.

Larry Godown made the motion to adjourn the meeting at 10:50 P. M. C. Stephens seconded — passed by 4 votes of yes.
