## Chamber of Commerce Activity Report

It isn't very often that an organization has to justify itself for its very existence so it is high time that the Chamber of Commerce reported on its activities since some people have been publicly criticizing what they do — or don't do.

Now we are accused as being an organization that only put up two signs on Route 17 — hold a Minstrel Show each year — and eat.

Taking the past along with the present — we promoted the Bulk-Tainer plant to come to Andover and stay for 5 years — which they did and more. Donations from the Public paid for the bulk of the building — but the last \$4,000 worth of bills which occurred out of the blue, were paid by the Chamber of Commerce by holding dances, raffles, horse pulls, etc.

The house numbering project was sponsored by the Chamber — and we still have some number left.

We paid for the Christmas Decorations on Main St. — and still pay for half of the damaged lights each year.

Paid for and installed flower boxes on Main Street and pay for the Christmas Trees that are placed in these boxes each year.

Pay for flowers in the "Island" at Memorial time each year. Sponsor the Boy Scouts and pay for their yearly Charter. Donated \$60.00 this year for the picnic table project to be built in the Grove, and paid for the original picnic tables in the Grove of which only a few are left.

Donate each year toward the Fourth of July Celebration — this year \$75 plus a float in the Parade.

Sponsor the Bike Rodeo every year for ACS children and pay for one bicycle in alternating years.

Each year honor the regents scholarship winners and parents at a dinner, and are the only organization to honor the athletic team at an annual dinner at our expense.

In the past we put on a dinner for underprivileged children at Christmas time — but now give presents to the School for distribution.

At one time sponsored the youth dances and helped the American Legion pay for the heat, gas, refreshments, and the record player.

Have on record at this time, a donation to be given to the Little League Park for installation of Public Facilities when the time comes that parents and children can see that they are not destroyed.

Make a donation of \$50 each year to the Andover Youth Base Ball Program.

Bought and installed the trash cans on Main St., Greenwood St. and Elm St.

Planted flowering crab trees on Route 17 & 21, which have since been cut or destroyed. Have evergreen trees available free of charge at the Harold Huffcutt residence.

Donated \$25 to the girl from Andover attending the National F.H.A. Convention last year.

Sponsored the Medical Center and took the responsibility of seeing that the bills were paid and the work was done. Our members procured the services of the original two Doctors — then we had one — now we have none. However, we are not discouraged — as we are working toward another.

The dues for this Organization are only \$16 per year, paid quarterly, and from this, members receive a meal 11 months of the year that cannot be beaten in quality and quantity — put on each month by the Ladies of the Grange in their Grange Hall.
