Mailbox Improvement For Rural Delivery

The Post Office Department signifies a week during May each year when patrons on rural and star route box deliveries are encouraged to examine and improve where necessary the appearance of their mailboxes. It has been suggested by the Department for patrons to talk with their Rural Carrier as to what improvement should be made if location is right, and the height of the boxes should be repaired so the bottom of the mail box is 41 inches from the roadway. Where boxes are not located directly in front of the owners residence, the patrons name and house or fire number should be shown on the box. A General Requirement by the Department is that mailboxes on the rural routes must be located on the right hand side of the road in the direction traveled by the carrier when they are serving the routes.
