Donald Nichols Seals Interest In Andover Garage

Don and his brother Howard Nichols opened their garage business on April 1, 1946 in the old Ligouri Lynch property on Main Street then moved to their present location in Nov. 1947.

In 1960 when the new Highway (Route 21) was built thru Andover the two brothers opened their new garage of which construction was started on in 1959 and operated it continuously until the retirement of Howard Nichols in 1967 when he sold his interest to Russ Crittenden.

Don and Russ operated the Andover Garage until January 1968 when it became a corporation.

Mr. Glover has worked part time in the Andover Garage Inc. for the past four years.

Russ and Encil will continue to operate the Garage and the Keystone Distribution in the same manner as before.

At the present time, Don tells us that he has no definite plans for the future but will continue to help the boys at the Andover Garage Inc.
