Approximately 750 seniors will receive the Associate in Applied Science or Associate in Science degree on Memorial Day when the 59th annual commencement exercises are held at State University Agricultural and Technical College at Alfred. The 11 a. m. ceremonies will take place on the college's West Side Campus.

One of the most prominent collegiate sports officials in New York State James A. McLane of Alfred, died Thursday, May 21, 1970 at Bethesda Community Hospital, N. Hornell, following a long illness. Scheduled for completion by June 28, 1972, all work will be under the supervision of Lewis W. Hallenbeck, regional director for the State Department of Transportation at Hornell.

Three Conservation Use Grasses Can Now Be Harvested For Silage

Millet, sudan grass, and sorghum-grass crosses can now be harvested for silage from a farmer's conserving base acreage, according to Stephen Clarke, Chairman of the Allegany County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation (ASC) Committee.

Previously, these crops could be used only for grazing, haying, or green chop feeding. Clarke said. He said sweet sorghum are not affected by this change since they are a feed grain and are not eligible for use on conserving base acreage if they are to be used for silage.

With this change, Clarke reminded farmers that these crops when planted on conserving base acreage still may not be harvested for seed or grain — only for silage.
