

School Board Holds Monthly Meeting

The regular meeting of the Board of Education of Andover Central School was called to order Monday, June 8, by the President, Mrs. Mary K. Slade. Mr. Kessler and the following Board members were present: Francis Horan, Conner Stephens.

The minutes of the previous meetings were read for approval. Motion to approve these was made by Mr. Horan, seconded by Mr. Stephens and carried by 3 votes of yes.

Mr. Kessler read the bills for the month of May 1970 amounting to \$17,183.73, plus utilities. Mr. Stephens made the motion that these be paid. Mr. Horan seconded the motion. Carried by 3 votes of yes.

Cafeteria bills in the amount of \$2,761.12 were read by Mr. Kessler. The motion to pay these was made by Mr. Horan and seconded by Mr. Stephens. Carried by 3 votes of yes.

The Treasurer's report was read for approval. Mr. Stephens made the motion that this report be accepted as read. Mr. Horan seconded the motion. Carried by 3 votes of yes.

The Cafeteria report was read by Mr. Kessler, showing a net loss of \$1,593.05 for the month of May 1970. A motion was made by Mr. Horan to file this report with the minutes. Seconded by Mr. Stephens and carried by 3 votes of yes.

The committee for the Cooperative Bread Bid recommended that the bid be awarded to Durkee's Domestic Bakery of Cortland, New York. Mr. Horan made the motion that this recommendation be accepted. Mr. Stephens seconded the motion. Carried by 3 votes of yes.

The Board approved the payment of the amount due on the New School which is Principal — \$25,000.00 and Interest — \$4,500.00. Mr. Stephens made the motion and Mr. Horan seconded. Carried by 3 votes of yes.

Payrolls amounting to \$41,101.47 were read to the Board for their approval. Mr. Horan made the motion that these be approved. Mr. Stephens seconded the motion. Passed by 3 votes of yes.

The names of the nominees for Bartz, Conde, Reil Scholarship were read by Mr. Kessler. These names are compiled by the Teachers' Committee. Mr. Horan made the motion that these be accepted and Mr. Stephens seconded. Carried by 3 votes of yes.

The Board accepted the resignation of Francis Vickers as bus driver, July 1, 1970. Mr. Vickers is retiring after nearly 30 years as a bus driver for Andover Central School.

Mr. Stephens made the motion that Mrs. Joyce Van Stine be granted leave of absence from September 1, 1970 to September 1, 1971. Mr. Horan seconded. Passed by 3 votes of yes.

Francis Horan made the motion that Mrs. Joan Bowden be granted a probationary appointment as Science teacher in the Jr. High School at a salary of \$8,875.00, seconded by Conner Stephens. Passed by 3 votes of yes.

C. Stephens made the motion to accept the swimming account report. Seconded by Mr. Horan and passed by 3 votes of yes.

The Board of Education accepted the negotiated agreement with the faculty.

Motion to adjourn at 10:42 P. M. was made by Francis Horan, seconded by C. Stephens, passed by 3 votes of yes.

At the regular meeting of Andover Village Board, held Monday night, Landis C. Kibbe, Village Clerk, since April 1, 1961, submitted a letter of retirement resignation to the Village Board. Replacing Mr. Kibbe, who plans to retire for the remainder of his unexpired term, will be Joan C. Dibble. Her duties will include acting as Village Clerk - Treasurer, tax-collector and Registrar of Vital Statistics.

Also a resolution was adopted to join the Town of Andover and Andover Central School for the summer youth program and authorized Mayor James F. Mulholland to sign application for refund from the State of 50% of the cost.

In other action the Board adopted a resolution to join with the County wide Planning Board of Towns and Villages.

The Board moved that on and after June 9, 1970, the Village of Andover will no longer replace water services or install new services from curb-stop-to-building. Furthermore materials used and installation must meet the approval of our Public Works Superintendent, before final hook-up to curb-stop.

Also the Village Board requested that residents refrain from dumping grass clippings and other refuse in any street gutters as this is the reason for the manholes becoming stopped up and preventing the natural water drainage.

I. Reid Mattison, Vice President and Manager of the Andover Office of The Citizens National Bank and Trust Company has returned this year to The Stonier Graduate School of Banking at Rutgers. Mr. Thomas was educated at Harvard College, the Harvard Business School and the University of Paris.
