Parents Cautioned On Illegal Use of Mini-Bikes

Albany — State Motor Vehicle Commissioner Vincent L. Tofany today cautioned parents that their own licenses and registrations could be placed in jeopardy by their children's illegal use of mini-bikes.

"Mini-bikes which are operated on public highways must be registered and their operators validly licensed," Commissioner Tofany said. "This means that the mini-bike must be properly insured, inspected and meet the other registration requirements. In addition, the mini-bike operator must possess a valid junior motorcycle or motorcycle license."

The Commissioner said that mini-bikes must be covered by automobile liability insurance of at least the minimum amount of \$10,000 - \$20,000 and \$5,000. He also pointed out that the minimum age to qualify for a license is 16.

"Mini-bikes are classed as motorcycles and must be operated in accordance with the provisions of the Vehicle and Traffic Law," Commissioner Tofany said. "Parents often purchase mini-bikes even though their children operate the vehicles. In such cases, a violation committed by the child could result in the suspension or revocation of the parent's license and registration."

He also noted that, there were no restrictions on operating mini-bikes on private property, the mini-bike rider should obtain permission from the owner before riding on private property. Failure to do so, he said, could result in prosecution for trespassing.
