Opening of an Allegany County YMCA in Wellsville in September has been assured by an offer of meeting space in the Christian Temple Church and a \$1,000 contribution from the Wellsville Lions Club, announced by former Mayor Eugene T. Forhan, chairman of a committee organized last March to explore the possibility of organizing a YMCA, describing the planned institution as a "family YMCA". The church, at Maple & Fassett, has offered the planned for YMCA use of a gymnasium, kitchen, sitting and meeting rooms in the church structure for a year.

Eligible voters of the Village of Wellsville will go to the polls between the hours of 8 a. m. and 9 p. m. this Thursday to determine the fate of a \$150,000 bond issue for funds necessary to construct new Fire and Police Department headquarters on South Main St. The design of the proposed new Fire-Police buildings provides not only a high degree of efficient and safe access to Main Street in a very central location, it offers attractive and efficient entry, both pedestrian and vehicular, to the

bulk of the Tuffar Field area, where permanent recreational facilities will be constructed as soon as possible.
