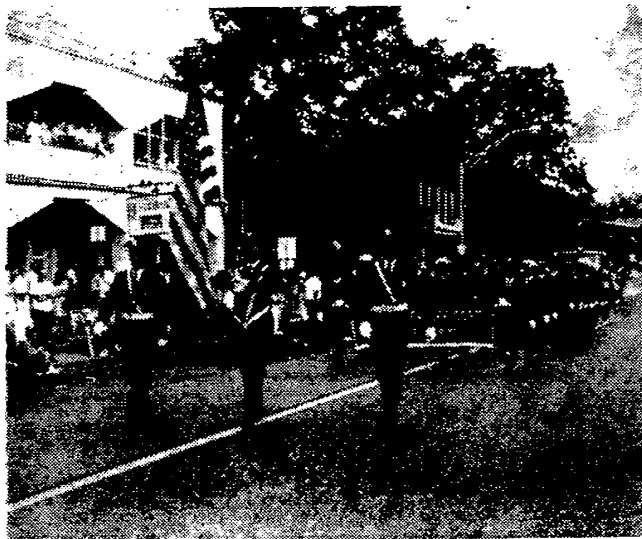

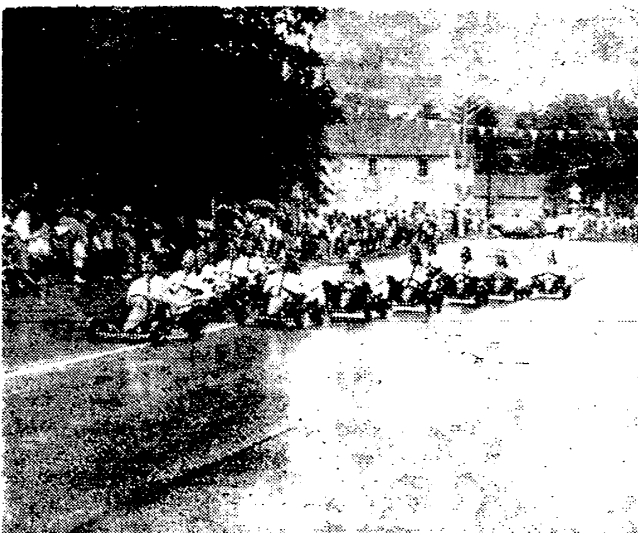
Rod & Gun Club To Hold Meeting Friday, July 17
