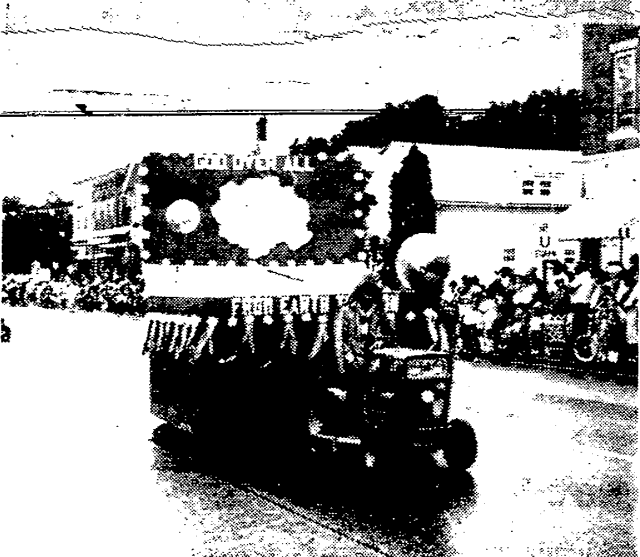
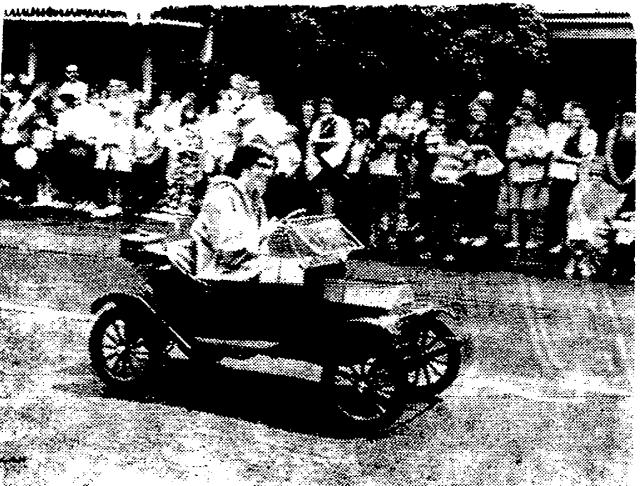

The Annual Meeting of the voters of Central School Dist. No. 1, Andover, Allegany County, New York was called to order Tuesday evening, July 14, 1970 by Ethel Kelley, acting Clerk of the Board of Education.

Nominations were opened for Chairman of the meeting. Nominated was Lawrence Corwin. Mr. Glenn Bronson made the motion and it was seconded by Jeanette Horan. Carried by a unanimous vote.

Lawrence Corwin appointed Ethel Kelley to serve as Clerk of the meeting and the tellers were Cathryn Vars and Regina Brown.

Minutes of the last Annual Meeting were read by Mrs. Kelley. Motion for approval of the minutes was made by Rosemary Burger and seconded by a unanimous vote.

Ethel Kelley read the Annual Financial Report for the school year 1969 - 70, showing a cash balance on hand July 1, 1970 of \$43,768.67.

Tax Collector's Report for the school year 1969-70:

A Motion to accept the above reports was made by Jeanette Horan and seconded by Regina Brown. Motion was carried unanimously.

Ethel Kelley read the Proposed Annual Budget for the school year 1970 - 71. The following resolution was presented by Mrs. Kelley:

Resolved, that the Board of Education of School District Number 1, Towns of Andover, Alfred, Wells, Independence, Ward and Greenwood in the Counties of Allegany and Steuben by and hereby is authorized to expend the sums set forth above of \$728,339.63, to accumulate a planned balance for July 1, 1971 and to levy the necessary tax therefore of \$20,119.95. Total Authorized amount \$748,459.58. Voting on the Budget was held. A total of 39 votes were cast with the following results: Ayes 35 Noes 2.

A petition was properly filed with the Clerk by Dr. William Walker for Trustee for a term of 4 years to succeed Robert Tomlin. 39 ballots were cast with the following results: Ayes 39 Noes 0.

A petition was properly filed with the Clerk by Francis Horan for Trustee for a term of 5 years to succeed himself. 39 ballots were cast with the following results: Ayes 39 Noes 0.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by W. Harris and seconded by K. Vars.

A shower was given for Bonnie Whitesell at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Lloyd Chaffee last Friday night.

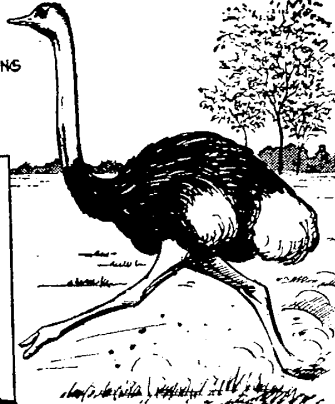

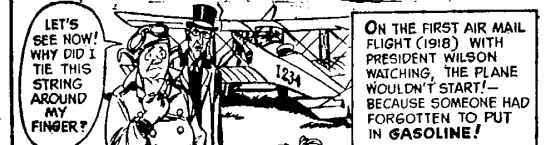
