

### Gary R. Wightman Named To Ag-Tech Faculty

A Wellsville resident who was among members of the first graduating class in Audio-Visual Technology at State University Agricultural and Technical College at Alfred, has been named to the faculty of that department.

He is Gary R. Wightman of Wellsville, R.D. 1, a 1970 graduate who has been appointed a technical assistant, according to Dr. David H. Huntington, college president.

Wightman, a native of Wellsville and a 1961 graduate of Andover Central School, enrolled with the first class of Audio-Visual Technology students in 1968 after being employed by the Sun Publishing Company of Alfred and later as a dark-room technician for a photography shop in Andover. He was also employed last summer as a dark-room technician and photographer for The Evening Tribune in Hornell.

Wightman, who graduated with high honors at Alfred State College, will be working with students in audio-visual laboratories in his new post. He will assist in their instruction by preparing A-V materials and equipment, primarily in the offset duplicating laboratory.

Wightman is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Richard Wightman of Andover. He is married to the former Janice Taylor of Wellsville, and they are parents of two children. His appointment to the faculty is effective Sept. 1.
