COUNTY OF ALLEGANY LOCAL LAW NO. 2 of 1970 A LOCAL LAW RELATING TO A CODE OF ETHICS AND A BOARD OF ETHICS FOR THE COUNTY OF ALLEGANY.

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Legislators of the County of Allegany as follows:

Intent of Board of Legislators

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SECTION 1. STATEMENT OF
LEGISLATIVE INTENT. The
Board of Legislators of the County
of Allegany recognizes that there
are state statutory provisions mandating counties to establish rules
and standards of ethical conduct
for public officers and employees
which, if observed, can enhance
public confidence in local government. In the light of a tendency
today on the part of some people
to downgrade our local governments and our free institutions
generally, it appears necessary
that every effort be made to assure the highest caliber of public
administration of this county as
part of our state's important system of local government. It is the
purpose of this local law to implement this objective through the
establishment of standards of conduct, to provide for punishment of
yiolation of such standards and to
create a board of ethics to render
advisory opinious to the county's
officers and employees as provided
for herein.

prohibited acts and procedures established herein are in addition to any prohibited acts, conflicts of interest provisions or prosedures to any prohibited acts, conflicts of interest provisions or procedures prescribed by statute of the state of New York and also in addition to common law rules and judicial decisions relating to the conduct of county officers to the extent that the same are more severe in their application than this local law.

ARTICLE II Code of Ethics

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS As used in this local law, the term "county" shall mean any board commission, district, council or other agency, department or unit of the government of the County of Allegany of Allegany

d. No county employee shall engage in any transaction as representative or agent of the county with any business entity in which with any ousness entity in which he has a direct or indirect financial interest that might reasonably tend to conflict with the proper discharge of his official duties.

e. A county employee shall not by his conduct give reasonable basis for the impression that any person can improperly influence him or unduly enjoy his favor in the performance of his official duties, or that he is affected by the tipship rank position or influence to the performance of the official duties or that he is affected by the tipship rank position or influence.

Each county employee shall abstain from making personal in-vestments in enterprises which he has reason to believe may be directly involved in decisions to be made by him or which will otherwise create substantial conflict between his duty in the public inter

at and his private interest.

g. Each county employee shall

endeavor to pursue a course of conduct which will not raise sus-picion among the public that he is likely to be engaged in acts that are in violation of his trust.

h. No county employee employed on a full-time basis nor any firm or association of which such employee is a member nor corporation a substantial portion of the stock of which is owned or controlled directly or indirectly by such employee, shall sell goods or services to any person, firm, corporation or association which is licensed or whose rates are fixed by the county in which such employee serves or is employed.

SECTION 4. VIOLATIONS. In addition to any penalty contained in any other provision of law, any such county employee who shall knowingly and intentionally violate any of the provisions of this local law may be fined, suspended or removed from office or employment in the manner provided by law.

ARTICLE III

Beard of Ethics

Beard of Ethics

SECTION 1. There is hereby established a board of ethics consisting of five members to be appointed by the Board of Legisla-tors, all of whom reside in the County of Allegany and who shall serve without compensation and at the pleasure of the Board of Legis-

the pleasure of the Board of Legislators of the County of Allegany. A majority of such members shall be persons other than county employees but shall include at least one member who is an elected or appointed county employee of the County of Allegany.

SECTION 2. The board of ethics established hereunder shall render advisory opinions to county employees on written request and upon request of the Board of Legislators make recommendations to such Board of Legislators as to any amendments of this local law. The opinions of the board of ethics shall be advisory and confidential and in no event shall the identity of the county employee be displaced experts. and in no event shall the identity of the county employee be disclosed except to authorized persons and agencies. Such opinions shall be on the advice of counsel employed by the board of ethics, or if none, of the county attorney. SECTION 3. Such board of ethics upon its formation shall promulgate its own rules and regulations as to its form and procedures and shall maintain appropriate records of its opinions and proceedings

ARTICLE IV Administration.

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SECTION 2. Within thirty days of the adoption of this local law the Clerk of the Board of Legislators shall file 8 copy thereof in the office of the state comptroller.

SECTION 3. The Board of Legislators may appropriate moneys from the general county funds for the maintenance of and for personnel services to the board of ethics established hereunder, but such board of ethics may not compute the expenditure of county mit the expenditure of county moneys except within the approp-riations provided therefor.

ARTICLE V Severability Clause

SECTION 1. If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this local law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidation the manifect theses. ment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

ARTICLE VI Effective Date

SECTION 1. This local law hall take effect immediately. Filed in the Office of the Sec etary of State on July 17, 1970.


