Former Resident Matches State Aid In Youth Program

Dr. James P. Lynch, Chairman of the Lynch Foundation at Los Angeles, Calif., son of Mrs. Charles Lynch and former resident of Andover, recently sent a check for \$789.70 to be presented to the summer youth program which matched the amount furnished by the State and the Town and Village of Andover for this worthwhile summer program.

Dr. Lynch was born and raised on the Charles C. Lynch Farm in Andover. He took a 2-year pre-med course at St. Bonaventure in Olean, N. Y., and then matriculated at the University of Buffalo, graduating from there under a 3-year accelerated Dental Program.

Dr. Lynch then spent 14 years in the Navy, retiring from the service as a Commander. He set up his own Dental Practice in Hollywood, California after leaving the Navy and has practiced there since that time.

The former Andover resident and Naval Officer has been active in the Real Estate field in addition to his Dental Practice and presently owns six apartment dwellings consisting of around 250 Units.

In addition to his philanthropic activities with Churches on the West Coast, he donated the present Altar to the Blessed Sacrament Church here in Andover.

The News Items about the State Aid allocated to Andover for Youth Recreation appeared in the July 23rd issue of the Andover News, and the date on the check donated by Dr. James P. Lynch is 3 August 1970. That sure is taking a timely interest isn't it?

And, while speaking of something of timely interest — here are a couple of things that all Motorists should read over carefully:

NEW LAWS — Headlights — Provides that every motor vehicle must display headlights if visibility for a distance of one thousand feet is not clear. (Effective September 1, 1970) — In other words, after official daylight, when it is raining hard, foggy, or in the evening before dusk.

— RIGHT OF WAY: Provides that a vehicle about to enter or cross a highway from an alleyway or building entrance shall give the right of way to other vehicles and pedestrians. (Effective October 1, 1970).

Also of interest — In a far-reaching opinion, Attorney General Louis J. Lefkowitz said this week that after September 1, 1970, existing garnishees against the earnings of employees making less than \$85 a week will be rendered of no effect. This means that after September 1, no garnishee may be placed on the wages of any employee earning less than \$85 and will virtually wipe out existing garnishees on salaries less than \$85.
