## Highway Bids To Be Opened By State Sept. 24

The details of 19 highway projects for which bids will be opened September 24 were listed today by State Transportation Commissioner T. W. Parker.

The projects have a total estimated cost of \$91,920,000 and will involve construction, reconstruction or other improvements to highways or bridges in 16 counties, as previously announced by Governor Rockefeller.

All bids will be opened publicly at 10:30 a. m., in the hearing room of the Department's Administration and Engineering Building at the State Office Campus, Albany.

Of particular interest to area and local residents, is the letting of contracts for over 18 more miles of the Southern Tier Expressway consisting of these projects:

### ALLEGANY

Construction of graded embankments for 7.7 miles of future four-lane divided pavements of the Southern Tier Expressway in the Towns of Almond and West Almond. An alignment generally south of and parallel to County Road 2 (Karr Valley Road) will be followed between points near Miller Road and Angelica Street. Related work totalling 2.6 miles of asphalt pavements will include relocation of portions of Miller and Karr Valley Roads and construction of access ramps near the project's western end. Twin bridges will be built over relocated Karr Valley Road (FASTE 70-11) Estimated at \$11,900,000.

### CATTARAUGUS

Construction of graded embankments for 5.5 miles of future four-lane divided pavements of the Southern Tier Expressway in the Towns of Olean and Hinsdale. The project will extend from near the City of Olean northeasterly to near the community of Maplehurst on an alignment generally parallel to and west of Route 16, and will connect two expressway sections now under construction. Related work totalling 2.5 miles will include reconstruction of area roads, construction of a service road for a mile southerly from Hastings Road and grading for Route 16 interchange ramps at the project's northern end. Expressway bridges will be built at seven sites. (FASTE 70-12) Estimated at \$16,200,000.

Construction of the Southern Tier Expressway for 6.35 miles in the Towns of Bath and Avoca. Twin two-lane concrete pavements separated by a variable median will extend northwesterly from the Village of Bath to near Route 70 on an alignment near Route 15 connecting two expressway sections now under construction. Related work totalling 6.6 miles will include construction of interchange with Route 53 and the future Genesee Expressway, reconstruction of local roads and construction of a safety parking and rest area with comfort station off the westbound

lanes about a half-mile south of Route 53. (FASTE 70-13) Estimated at \$18,000,000.

## ALLEGANY VIDEO, INC.

Allegany Video, Inc., has been negotiating with Addison Cable TV with the intent of acquiring their Andover cable system. Prior to the completion of purchase, Allegany Video has requested approval of a rate increase and certain changes in the current franchise.

In the event that Allegany Video provides Andover with cable TV services, the following policies would go into effect:

- No. 1. All subscribers rates would be increased to \$5.50 monthly for the first connection, the next three outlets \$1.00 additional, and over 4 outlets a monthly charge of \$.50 per outlet would be made. Rates would not be increased until subscriber is receiving the 11 channels.
- No. 2. There would be NO charge when subscribers of Addison Cable are transferred to Allegany Video.
- No. 3. Installation for new subscribers would be \$8.00 plus tax.
- No. 4. Reconnect fee, more wire, or a move within the premises would be billed at \$5.00 plus tax.
- No. 5. 6 1/2% discount will be allowed on annual payment.
- No. 6. Free service would be provided to Andover Central School.
