Annual Missionary Convention To Be Held In Andover

Rev. John W. Hall and Rev. Lee A. Peters will be guest speakers at the Annual Missionary Convention to be held in the Christian And Missionary Alliance Church on Rochambeau Avenue. The services will begin Sunday, October 11 in the 11:00 A. M. Service and will continue nightly at 7:45 P. M. through Wednesday, October 14.

Mr. Hall with his wife went to teach in a school for Missionary children in Malasia in 1966 but in 1967 they were sent to Vietnam for ministries among the South Vietnamese soldiers. Mr. Hall has traveled extensively throughout Vietnam and will be able to give some first hand information as to the conditions of a country that is torn by war. He and his wife escaped capture in the Tet offensive in 1968 by hiding in an underground storeroom and after a very anxious night they were rescued by an American helicopter and taken to an American base. He has been ministering in the Army Hospital in Saigon for the past year where he has had personal contact with the South Vietnam wounded soldiers.

Mr. Lee A. Peters was sent to the Philippines in 1966 where he

and his wife took an intensive study of the Cebuano dialect in order to minister to the people of the Island of Mindanao about 90 miles from Zamboanga City. He has ministered in many youth rallies in the Islands and for the past year has been on the executive committee of the Alliance Missions in the Islands.

These men will have pictures and curios of the work and will be glad to answer any questions which might be asked concerning the conditions that exist in their respective areas.

The Christian And Missionary Alliance is a missionary organization that has nearly 900 missionaries in 25 different fields of the world with its international headquarters in New York City. The local church is one of 1300 churches located in this country.

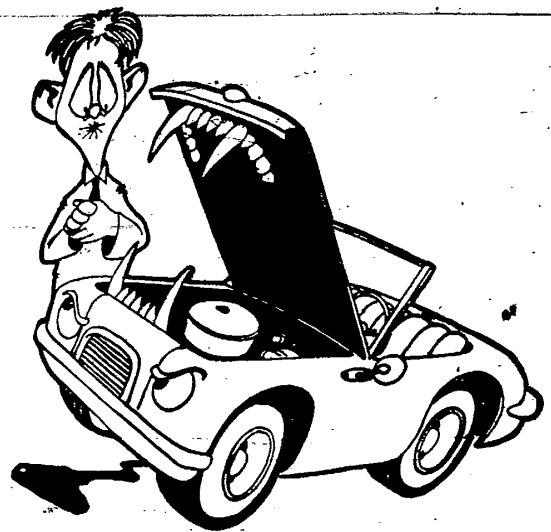

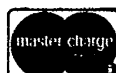
