The Panthers will run in the Alfred-Almond Invitational on Saturday, October 17.

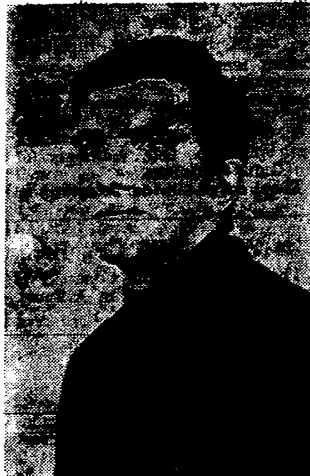
