## School Board Holds Monthly Meeting

The regular meeting of the Board of Education of Andover Central School was called to order Monday evening, November 9, by President, Francis Horan. Mr. Kessler and the following Board members were present: Mr. Stephens, Mr. Walker, Mr. Tuttle and Mrs. Slade.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read for approval. Motion to approve these minutes was made by Mr. Tuttle, seconded by Mr. Stephens. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

The Clerk's and District Treasurer's reports were read for comparison and approval. These reports were moved for approval by Mrs. Slade and seconded by Mr. Tuttle. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Motion for approval was made by Mr. Walker. Seconded by Mr. Stephens. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Resolution passed by 5 votes of yes that the bills — in the amount of \$9,151.01, plus utilities, against the General Fund for October 1970 and \$1,459.73 Cafeteria, as certified by Mr. Kessler, be paid. The motion was made by Mr. Tuttle and seconded by Mrs. Slade.

The Cafeteria report was read by Mr. Kessler, showing a net gain of \$51.07 for the month of October. A motion was made by Mr. Tuttle to file this report with the minutes, seconded by Mrs. Slade. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Motion was made by Mr. Tuttle to authorize Francis Horan to sign the School Tax return of \$9,137.85 unpaid taxes plus penalties. Mr. Walker seconded the motion. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

The Board approved the transfer of \$104.73 to cover two amounts that were taken Monday night thru theft. Mrs. Slade made the motion and Mr. Tuttle seconded. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Dr. Wm. Walker made the motion that the Code of Ethics for ACS be adopted. Mr. Stephens seconded. Carried by 5 yes votes.

Mrs. Slade moved and Mr. Tuttle seconded that Mr. Bronson and Mrs. Burger attend NYS Teachers Conf. House of Delegates and Mrs. Boyce attend the Music Conference. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

The Board of Education approved the transfer of \$29.13 to Title I ESEA to close out the Grant. Moved by Dr. Walker and seconded by Mr. Tuttle. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Mrs. Slade made the motion to adjourn at 9:45. Seconded by Mr. Tuttle and carried by 5 yes votes.
