### Future Nurses

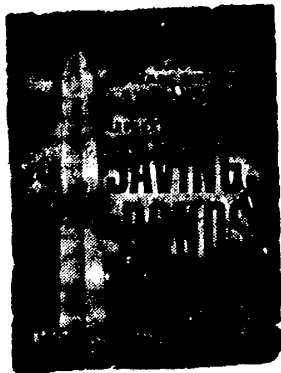

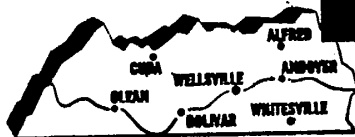
