Livestock Survey To Be Made

The Rural Route carriers, Roland P. Kemp and John L. Cannon from the Andover Post Office will begin to distribute December Livestock cards to farmer patrons along their route on Tuesday, November 24th.

This survey is one of three in which the Post Office Department assists the U. S. Dept. of Agriculture each year. Some 20,000 questionnaire cards for the current survey will be distributed to farmers throughout New York State.

The Livestock cards should be filled in by the farmers and returned to their carriers and the forms will be mailed to the New York Crop Reporting Service in Albany.

The rural Carriers will try and make every reasonable effort to serve their patrons during the winter months and bad weather. They are not required however to provide service on foot when roads are impassable or attempt to provide service by motor vehicle during periods of inclement weather when administrative authorities consider road travel hazardous. Customers are responsible for keeping the approaches to their boxes clear of snow and all other obstruction which may make delivery of mail difficult.

New Lunch Program Plans Announced

On or before Monday, January 4, 1971 the following schools in Allegany County will operate under the new Federal regulations regarding the National School Lunch Program: Andover, Angelica, Belfast, Belmont, Bolivar, Cuba, Fillmore, Friendship, Rushford, Scio, Whitesville, and Wellsville.

On or before December 1, 1970 a letter or notice will be distributed to each parent in each school district. Such letter or notice will contain the following information:

1. Eligibility standards.
2. How a family may make application.
3. How a family may appeal in the event that family should be denied free lunches.

The above information will be available upon request at the office of each school district in the county.
