When the war on proverty was declared six years ago experts viewed the situation as one that could be cured by 1975 with jobs, education, goodwill and welfare programs. The Committee for Economic Development has recently issued a report in which they state that urban poverty will be a fact for many years. Even with radical and costly new government programs, 50% of the poor are not susceptible to being saved.

programs, 50% of the poor are not susceptible to being saved.

Other facts which the committee uncovered are:

— Absolute number of poor declined from 40 million in 1959 to 25 million in 1968. In relative terms, no decline whatsoever has occurred in the last twenty years.

— Out of 13 million poor in Metropolitan areas, two-thirds are white and one-third is black, Puerto Rican. Chicano. Oriental or Americans

Rican, Chicano, Oriental or American Indian. But in the centers of cities, non-whites account for near-

ly one-half the poor.

— 50% of the poor cannot be expected to become economically self-sustaining at any time in the

- Low wages are responsible for

— Low wages are responsible for twice as much poverty as is unemployment.
— 5.4 million children account for 42.2% of the urban poor. Undernourishment in 63% of poor families is a direct cause of brain damage. The government is spending five billion dollars (almost half of the eleven billion dollars now spent) to provide 250.000 new jobs. raise the minimum wage to \$1.70 an hour, set-up day care centers and improve schools. But even with these advances, it will be many years before the number of poor is decreased substantially.
