A.C.S. Seniors Win Regents Scholarships

From this year's graduating class, four Seniors have won New York State Regents or Nursing Scholarships. Four Seniors have also been named as alternates for Regents or Nursing Scholarships. The students receiving the Regents Scholarships are: Andy Gram, Lynn Panton, and Daniel Slade. Laurie Collins, Debby Nichols and Joan Wightman have been named as alternates to receive the Regents Scholarships. Laurie Collins is also the recipient of a Regents Nursing Scholarship. Alternates for this Scholarship are Grace Herr and Denise Maples.

Andy Gram, the son of Mr. and Mrs. James Gram is considering a course in Engineering Science at Clarkson, Alfred State Tech or Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Lynn Panton, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Charles B. Panton, has plans for pursuing a Liberal Arts program in either Eisenhower or Wells College.

Daniel Slade is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Raymond Slade. He hopes to receive an appointment to the Naval Academy at Annapolis. Dan has the honor of having the fifth highest score in Allegany County which received 63 Scholarships.

Laurie Collins, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. T. Collins, hopes to pursue a nursing program at Alfred State Tech. Laurie is to be commended for having received the Nursing Scholarship as well as having been named as an alternate for a Regents Scholarship.

Debby Nichols, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Donald Nichols, whose plans are indefinite at the present time, may possibly pursue a Liberal Arts program.

Joan Wightman, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Richard B. Wightman is considering Alfred State College or Genesee in her future plans.

Grace Herr, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. David N. Herr, also plans

to study nursing, possibly at St. Joseph's in Elmira.

Denise Maples, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Donald Logan, has plans for a career in nursing.

The holder of a New York State Regents Scholarship will be entitled to an annual award of \$250 to \$1,000 depending on financial need for each of four years of his college course while attending any college in the State of New York approved by the Regents for this purpose. In addition, scholarship holders may be eligible to receive scholar incentive awards of \$100 to \$500 up to the cost of tuition depending on the family income.

The recipient of a New York State Nursing Scholarship will be entitled to an annual award of \$200 to \$500 depending on financial need for each year up to five years of nursing study at a college or at a hospital school of professional nursing in New York State. Scholarship winners may also receive scholar incentive assistance of up to \$600 a year. In the event that a scholarship winner declines the award or is unable to accept the award for any reason the scholarship is offered to the highest ranking nurse-alternate in that county.
