Village Board Special Meeting

A Special Meeting of the Village Board of Trustees was held in the Village Office January 10, 1973 at 7:30. Those present: James Kessler Mayor; Robert Baker, William Dunham, Glenn Thorp and Ronald Glover, Trustees.

The following resolution was offered by Robert Baker and seconded by William Dunham, who moved its adoption, and was duly carried unanimously:

WHEREAS, The United States Department of Agriculture has allocated funds to be administered by the Soil Conservation Service for emergency treatment assistance to protect lives and property from floodwater, erosion and sediment discharge resulting from the damages created by tropical storm Agnes, and

WHEREAS, The Village of Andover has need for this assistance. NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Village of Andover

1. Hereby accept sponsorship for and requests the emergency assistance made available by the Service.
2. Will acquire the necessary permits, land and water rights, licenses and clearances needed for the installation of the emergency treatment measures by the Service on the property of individual landowners located within the Village of Andover.
3. Accept all financial and other responsibilities resulting from its failure to obtain or its delay in obtaining adequate permits, land and water rights, licenses and clearances needed for the emergency treatment measures.
4. Will designate an individual to assist in establishing priorities, acquire land rights, assure clearances from O.E.P. and D.E.C., and perform other duties necessary to carry out the responsibilities of the Village of Andover under this resolution.
5. Will provide a copy of this resolution to the Soil Conservation Service.
6. Will hold and save the United States free from damages due to the approved work; and with respect to debris removal and stream-bank protection shall in-

demnify the Federal Government against any claim arising from such work.

This concluded the business and the meeting was adjourned.
