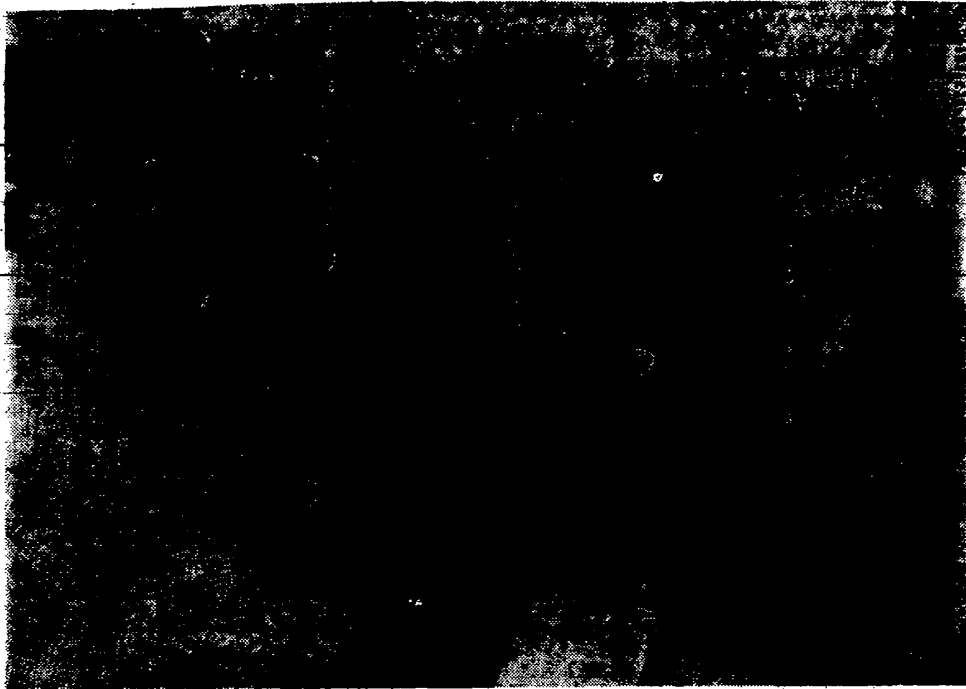

Bus trips to historic sites, conservation areas, and seashore camping are among the opportunities to be offered to every girl in every troop of the Southern Tier Girl Scout Council as a result of this year's Cookie Sale.

Throughout Steuben and Allegany counties the sale started Friday, January 26. "Cookie Money" is a special fund in the Council, which uses the profits only for direct girl benefit. Formerly, it was devoted mainly to the development of the Council's four camps.

A survey of troop program in which every girl participated has shown "trips" to be on the top of the list of programs desired. Accordingly, this spring, a series of trips are planned for each level—Brownies through Seniors, with the Council paying for the transportation.

Last summer 570 boys and girls from flood areas attended Council Camps, with assistance from the cookie profits. The pots, lamps, generators, stoves, and foods from the camps were then sent to reach evacuation sites during the flood and all came from the cookie sale profits.

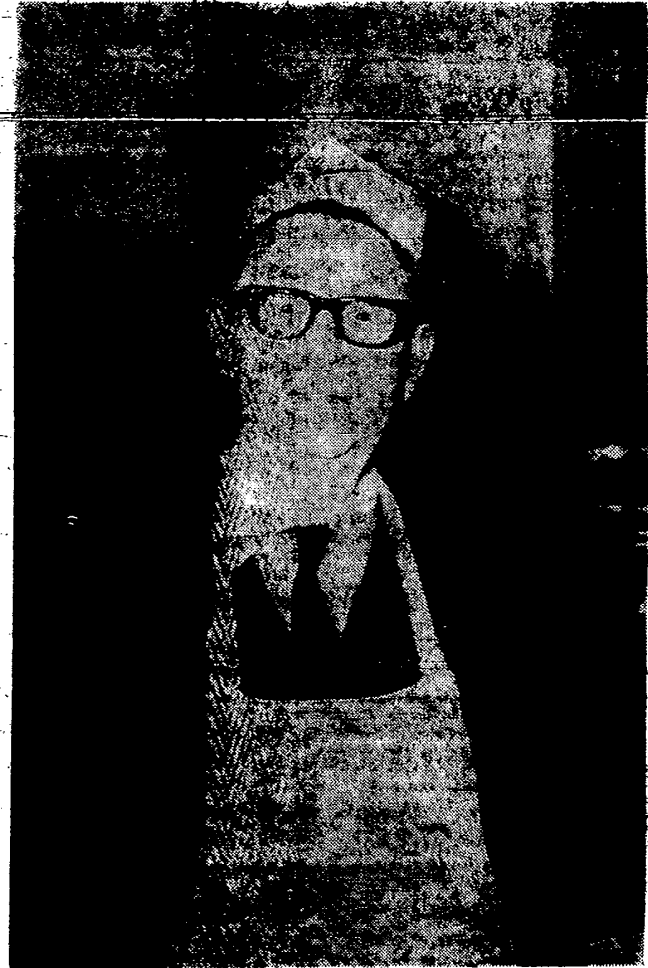
