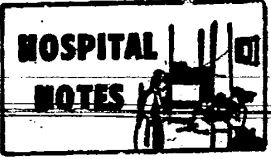
Representatives from all local Organizations are invited to attend, as well as any interested Citizens who are willing to lend a hand in this civic-minded project.
