School Board Monthly Meeting

The regular meeting of the Board of Education of Andover Central School was called to order Monday evening, February 12, 1973, by the President, Mr. Carl Atwell. Mr. Weibezahl and the following Board members were present: Conner Stephens, Francis Horan, William Walker and Mary K. Slade.

The minutes of the January 8th, 1973 regular meeting were read for approval. Francis Horan made the motion to accept these minutes and Conner Stephens seconded the motion. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

The bills for the month of January were accepted as certified. Mary K. Slade made the motion and William Walker seconded. Carried by 5 votes of yes. The amount — \$12,400.37.

Cafeteria bills in the amount of \$2,051.66 were certified. Carl Atwell made the motion and Francis Horan seconded. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

The Treasurer's report was read for comparison. Francis Horan made the motion to accept this report. William Walker seconded the motion. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

The Cafeteria report was read by Mr. Weibezahl showing a net profit of \$328.88 for the month of January. A motion was made by Mary K. Slade to file this report with the minutes. Seconded by Carl Atwell. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

The Payrolls for the month were read for approval. The total amount of these was \$42,161.16. Francis Horan made the motion that these be approved. Seconded by Mary K. Slade. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Dr. Walker made the motion to allow the transfer of \$2,000.00 to Federal Funds in anticipation of federal monies to be received. Motion seconded by Carl Atwell. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Carl Atwell made the motion that interfund transfers be made within the Subsidiary Account — per list attached. Francis Horan seconded the motion. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

The motion was made by Conner Stephens that Andover Central School participate in Cooperative bidding for bread and bread products for the school year 1973-74 with other school districts in the Southern Tier of New York State, seconded by Francis Horan, passed by 5 votes of yes.

Motion made by Mary K. Slade that the President be allowed to borrow \$20,000 on Revenue Anticipation Note for Flood Recovery Expenses. Motion passed by 5 votes of yes and seconded by Conner Stephens.

Andover will participate in a cooperative bid for various duplicating papers and ink. This will be a group bid. Resolution was passed by 5 yes votes. Mary K. Slade made the motion and Conner Stephens seconded.

The Lions Club members donated new glass Blackboards to Andover Central School. Our sincere appreciation to them for this generous gift.

Francis Horan made the motion and Mary K. Slade seconded that the school be used during the Maple Syrup Festival. Carried by 5 yes votes.

Resolution was made that Arlene Jackson be hired as a substitute Bus Driver. Francis Horan made the motion and Carl Atwell seconded. Carried by 4 yes votes.

Flood Recovery bills for \$15,562.83 were submitted for payment. Mary K. Slade made the motion that these be paid and the motion was seconded by Francis Horan. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Title II Basic claim for \$6.78 was submitted for payment. Conner Stephens made the motion that this be paid. Mary K. Slade seconded the motion. Passed by 5 votes of yes.
