Alfred University's department of physics has received an outright grant of about a quarter of a pound of plutonium, a radioactive material, from the Atomic Energy Commission in Washington. Valued at \$3,249, the material had been on loan to the University from the A.E.C. for the past eight years. The direct grant supercedes the loan agreement. Dr. George C. Towe, professor of physics, made the original application for the material and currently supervises its use as a teaching and research aid in the University's general physics and radioisotope laboratories.
