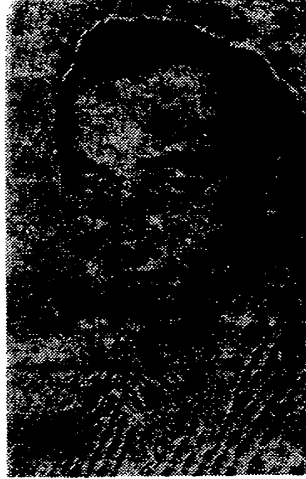


AVERY R. MEAD

LISTEN VETERAN

1973 DIVIDENDS - GI INSURANCE - The 1973 regular dividend on GI insurance will set a record high and the dividends will be paid on the anniversary dates in 1973 and not on an accelerated basis as has been done in several instances in recent years. The 1973 dividend on National Service Life Insurance policies will average about \$72 per policy which is about \$4 higher than the average per policy in 1972. For some 147,000 holders of World War I USGLI policies, their 1973 dividends will average \$143 per policy compared to only \$135 per policy last year.

HERE'S A TAX TIP When filing your state and federal income tax forms you need not include benefits received under the GI Bill! That includes educational allowances, pension, compensation, grants to disabled veterans for wheelchair, homes or specially equipped motor vehicles, proceeds from GI insurance, GI insurance dividends, and burial allowances. Be sure, however to declare any interest earned on GI insurance dividends left on deposit with the VA - it's not a benefit under the GI Bill.

CHANGE IN DISCHARGE MAY BRING DENTAL CARE When a veteran's discharge from military service is changed by competent authority from "under dishonorable conditions" to "under honorable conditions", the veteran has one year from the date of correction to apply for dental treatment. His application within this period is considered timely, and eligibility is determined in the same manner as for other applicants for dental care.
