The U.S. Marine Band from Camp Lejeune, N. C. will appear in two concerts to be presented this week-end at Cuba Central School.

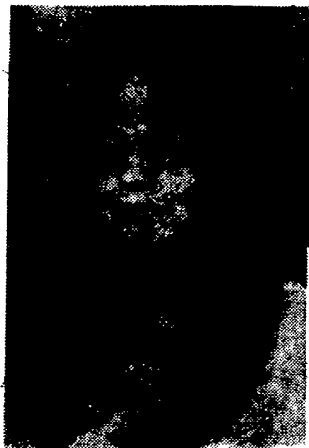
The Second Division Band, under the leadership of Sgt. A. D. Moseley, will play at 8 p. m., Saturday and again at 2 p. m. Sunday.
