

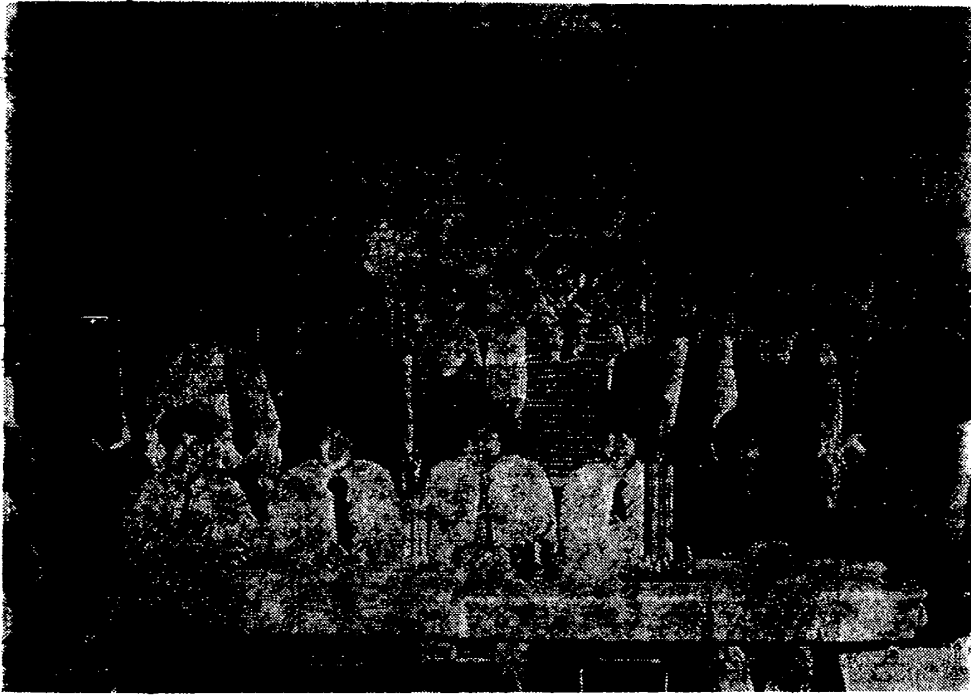

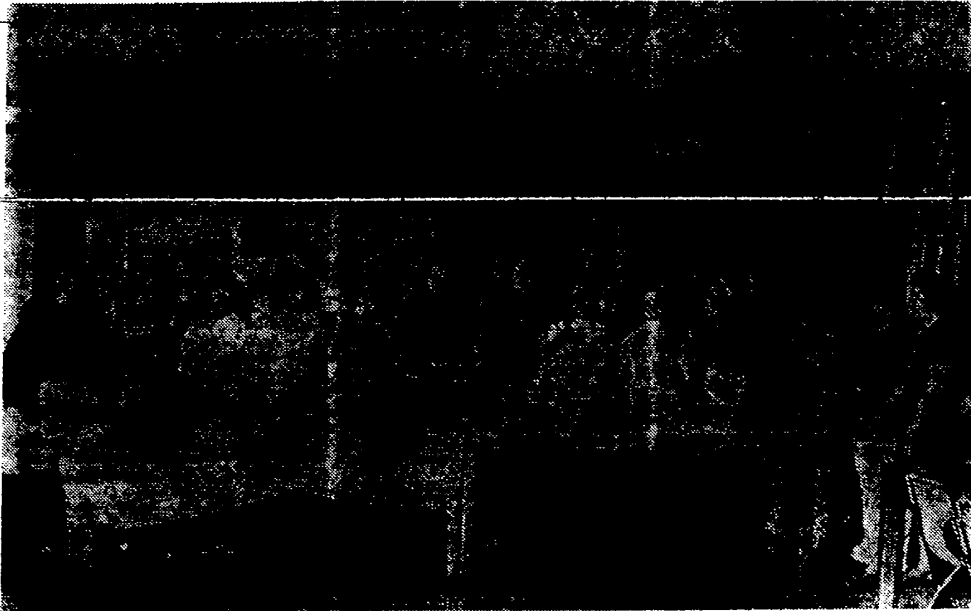

## Alfred Ag-Tech To Hold Band and Orchestra Festival

A record 55 bands and orchestras, including the Defiance, Ohio, Concert Band, will perform during the sixth Annual Band-Orchestra Festival Thursday through Saturday (March 29-31) at State University Agricultural and Technical College at Alfred.

The festival, which was started by Joseph Canale in 1967, had 18 bands the first year and was staged in two days. It has since been expanded to three days. There were 36 bands last year and the 55 which will appear this year is the largest number ever to perform.

Professor Canale, who is director of instrumental music, estimates that some 3,500 junior high, senior high, and college musicians will participate in the program which is open to the public without charge.

Thirteen schools will perform in the student activities center and will be evaluated on the first day of the event, 26 on Friday and 14 on Saturday.

New features of this year's festival are daily clinics and directors' workshops.

The Clinic Thursday and Friday will be at 11 a. m. and 2 p. m., and will be conducted by Charles Morey of Monroe Community College and Don Hughes of Perry Central School. They will discuss problems of the stage band percussion and rhythm section.
